SHE BELONGS IN SCHOOL



Supporting girls' education and fostering girls' empowerment in northern Mozambique



Adolescent girls in Mozambique face many challenges to accessing a full course of primary and secondary education, including inability to pay for costs related to education, long distances to school, and socio-cultural pressure to marry early. Culturally, there is a perception that there is limited value in educating girls and young women, who are expected to focus on marriage and having children. During the period of adolescence (10-19), girls are particularly vulnerable to dropping out of school. In the provinces of Niassa and Nampula in northern Mozambique.

To address these challenges Save the Children is introducing "She Belongs in School" – a 5-year project (April 2022 to August 2026) that will be implemented across 7 districts in Nampula and Niassa provinces: Nacaroa, Memba, Erati, Muecate, Mandimba, Cuamba, and Macanhelas.

THE OBJECTIVES OF SHE BELONGS IN SCHOOL INCLUDE:

- Improving the literacy and numeracy skills and sense of empowerment of adolescent girls
- Adolescent girls feel an increased sense of selfbelief and leadership, support from their families and communities, and have more decision-making power
- Family members and communities are supportive of girls' rights, particularly the right to education
- Schools and non-formal learning spaces in their communities are safe, supportive, and offer high-quality education



She Belongs in School will involve a variety of interventions at the level of the girl herself, her family, her community, her school, and her local government. These interventions include:

- Communication campaigns to change attitudes and mindsets of students, their families and wider communities;
- Supporting community-led groups to advocate for education:
- Mentorship groups for adolescent girls and boys to impart practical life skills;
- Collaboration with teachers, school administrators, and local government to improve the operation of School Councils.
- Provide continuous teacher professional development, and
- Deliver extra-curricular programs.
