1. ECHO - EDUCATION IN EMERGENCIES June-2022/23

GEOGRAPHICAL AREA OF INTERVENTION: Nangade, Palma, Mueda, Mueda and Montepuez (new districts) Chiure and Metuge districts.

Main objectives

Increased access and retention to safe, protective, quality, and inclusive learning environments for children in Cabo Delgado.

Brief summary

The project aims to increase access, retention and transition of crisis affected boys and girls in Cabo Delgado. It will provide a quick, effective, and efficient response that is highly flexible and adaptable to rising needs through a set of key interventions.

The project will also ensure that school environments are safe and accessible,

including latrines and WASH facilities, to all children also those with disabilities. The thematic areas are CP, Education, WASH and Disability Inclusion.



2. BHA - LIFESAVING HEALTH, NUTRITION, WASH, AND CHILD PROTECTION SERVICES FOR DISPLACED AND VULNERABLE POPULATION

April 2021/ March 2024

GEOGRAPHICAL AREA OF INTERVENTION: Chiure, Metuge and Pemba

Main Objectives

- Prevent and reduce excess mortality and morbidity
- Strengthen the protective environment among IDP and host communities



Brief summary

Save the Children is implementing a \$3m, 12-month (soon to be extended to 24 months with an additional \$2.5m) integrated Health, Nutrition, WASH, and Child Protection project. In addition to supporting 3 health facilities with capacity building, medical supplies, and pharmaceuticals, the project established and operates Mobile Health Brigades (MHBs) in 15 communities (10 in Chiure, 5 in Metuge), extending regular maternal, newborn and child primary healthcare 5 days per week to IDPs and host

communities that otherwise almost entirely lack access due to distance and cost.

Each MHB team is staffed with 2 clinicians, 1 maternal and child health nurse, 1 preventive medicine technician, 1 nutrition technician, and 1 pharmacist. This team provides sick consultations as well as growth monitoring and nutrition prevention/ response (includes child vaccinations and vitamin supplementation for children and PLW). WASH and CP interventions are additionally integrated with the MHBs, all with the goal of providing the most comprehensive and holistic assistance to these 15 communities. In this regard, SC is increasing water supply and improving sanitation and hygiene in the same communities in order to ensure the best health and nutrition outcomes.

Three CFSs have also been constructed and community caseworkers and psychosocial activists have additionally been trained in these communities, allowing for referrals between and among the sectors. Under this project, SC has reunified approximately 20 UASC with their families.

3. SIDA - SIDA HUM COSACA 2022

GEOGRAPHICAL AREA OF INTERVENTION: Chiure and Montepuez

Main Objectives

 Targeted communities have access to strengthened child protection, education and WASH services, and

are better able to identify and respond to urgent child protection risks (including SGBV and MHPSS) and meet their basic needs.

Brief summary

The project will be implemented by COSACA consortium and will target vulnerable women, girls, boys, men and people with disability through different sectors:

Child Protection and SGBV (Save the Children)

Girls and boys have better and more equitable access to lifesaving child protection services that ultimately improve their safety and wellbeing through a strengthened child protection system;

Protection - SGBV (CARE

International)

Increased resilience of conflictaffected communities to withstand and respond to protection-related consequences of conflict and displacement. Education (Save the Children)
Vulnerable girls and boys, both IDPs
and host communities, have access to
a safe, quality, and inclusive learning
environment

WASH (CARE International)

Vulnerable IDP and host community households have improved access to sanitation and hygiene material and services to meet their immediate WASH needs in dignity and safety.



4. BMZ - STRENGTHENING THE RESILIENCE OF CONFLICT-AFFECTED COMMUNITIES IN CABO DELGADO FOR A SECURE AND INCLUSIVE FUTURE

April 2021/March 2024

GEOGRAPHICAL AREA OF INTERVENTION: Chiure and Montepuez

Main Objectives

 To build resilient structures for a peaceful and secure future of internally displaced people (IDPs) jointly with their host communities in Cabo Delgado Province.

Brief summary

Interventions aims to increase agricultural pro-duction and livelihood diversification, hence in-creasing food consumption and diversity of food sources. In resettlement areas, implementation combines a series of elements covering farm and non-

farm activities, income generation and capacity building of partners and beneficiaries, engaging IDPs and host communities.

5. HF - HUMANITARIAN FUND CABO DELGADO IDP October 2021

GEOGRAPHICAL AREA OF INTERVENTION: Mueda

Main Objectives

 Scale up IDP response in Cabo Delgado in new, previously inaccessible or hard to reach communities to critical child protection and education needs.

Brief summary

The initiative will be used to kick start new activities and operations in Mueda and allow feasibility assessments to be conducted in Palma, Nangade and be operational in the southern areas by setting up offices in Montepuez and Chiure.

The intrventions include: (I) Distribution of Essential Non-food Items to newly displaced IDPs in Mueda. SC is providing essential non-food items to restore

dignity of UASC and their families, having been displaced several times. The kits are gender sensitive especially considering the needs of the child-girl and highly distressed children in need of mental health and psychosocial support (II) Child Protection Activities SC is providing life-saving child protection activities, mainly identification, registration and referral of UASC: access to essential child protection services for vulnerable children and at-risk children in the host community; family tracing and reunification of UASC with parents. and relatives. SCI is also rolling-out Team-Up, a signature mental health and psychosocial approach for distressed and traumatized children affected by conflict and crisis, in both child friendly spaces and schools/Temporal learning Spaces (TLS).

(III) Education in Emergencies Activities SC is focussing on 1 IDP (Eduardo Mondlane Center) camp for EiE response, and will construct temporary structures (02 TLS and 02 CFS) using local materials. SC is working in partnership with community volunteers to provide TLS lessons.
