CONTEXT

Health



77.9% of urban children (aged 12-23 months) have received all their vaccinations compared to **61.7%** of children in rural areas.



Neonatal mortality rate is **34 per 1000** live births. Infection, pre-term and Asphyxia are the leading causes of the deaths.

Nutrition



43% of children in Mozambique are stunted. Exclusive breastfeeding is at 41%.

Education



Children proficiency level in grade 2 and 3 stands at:
 • Reading (**78%** boys; 77% girls)
 • Maths (**70%** boys; 64% girls)

Child Marriage & Teenage Pregnancy



- **48%** of girls get married before the age of 18 years and 14% before 15 years.
- **67%** and **49.8%** of adolescent girls have had their first children at age 19 and 18 years respectively.

Sexual Violence



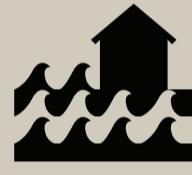
Nearly **1 in 10** girls experience sexual violence before the age of 18 years. For boys the rate is 1 out of 100.

Child Poverty



48% of children are experiencing two or three severe deprivations.

Disaster prevalence rate



Central and southern regions make up to 85% of flood affected; 75% of cyclone affected; and 93% of drought affected.

Child Rights Governance

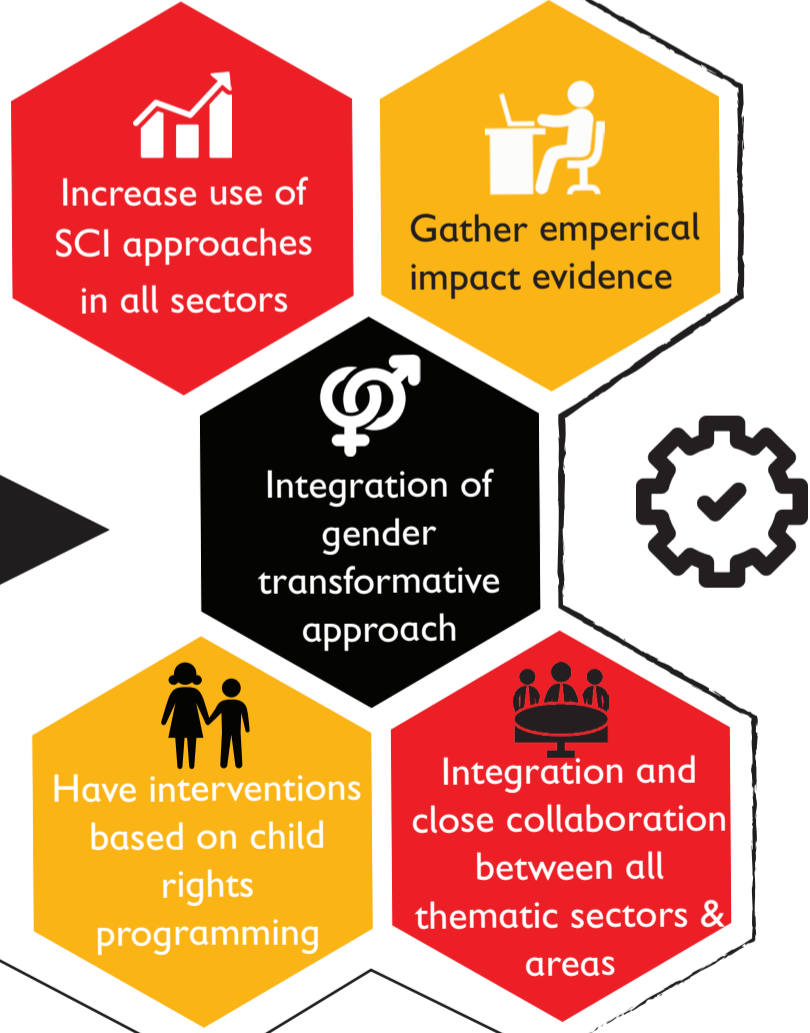
Influence Mozambique Government to become more effective in terms of accountability and delivering basic social services for realization of child rights
